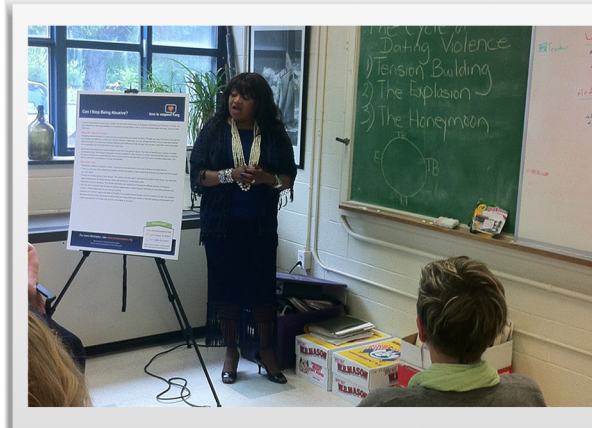

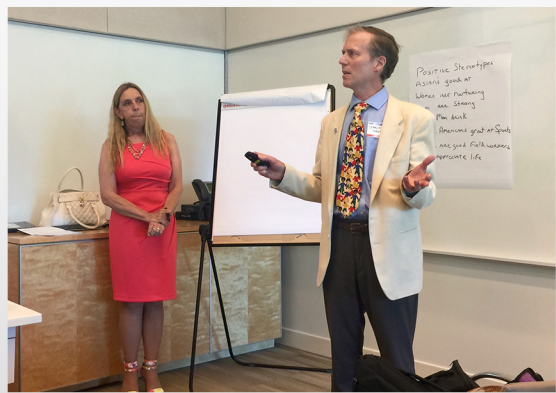

One of the many services SAFE provides is a Speakers Bureau to educate communities on domestic violence, dating violence, bullying, sibling abuse, elderly abuse, and more.

Our Speakers Bureau presents accurate, balanced, and objective information about intimate partner violence with a focus on those who typically fall between the cracks of domestic violence services. These groups include men, LGBT, teens, and the elderly.

Speakers are approved by the SAFE Board of Directors and represent a broad range of expertise. Each speaker agrees with the mission, goals, and purpose of SAFE. Joint presentations by two or more speakers are encouraged. Speakers are available for trainings, lectures, panels discussions, and seminars.

NEWS ARTICLES

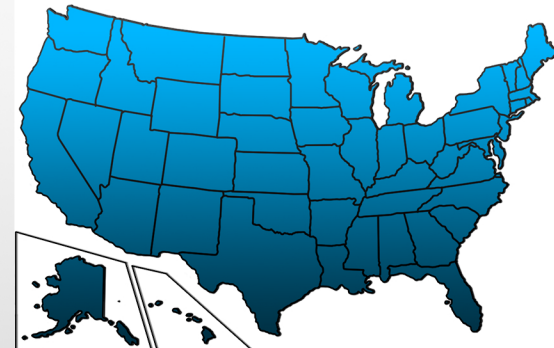
